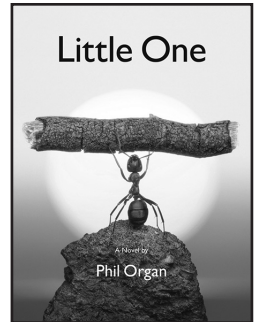


Little One The Novel by PHIL ORGAN

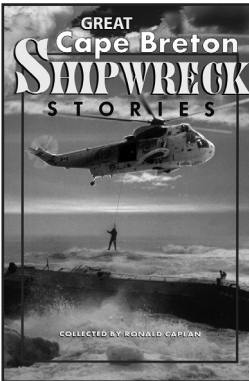
Great Cape Breton Shipwreck Stories collected by RONALD CAPLAN

From the gut-wrenching trek of the survivors of the *Auguste* to John Angus Fraser's hilarious adventures aboard the abandoned *Kismet II*, to Walter Boudreau's harrowing days adrift in a lifeboat—this book is a tribute to the tradition of Cape Breton storytelling.

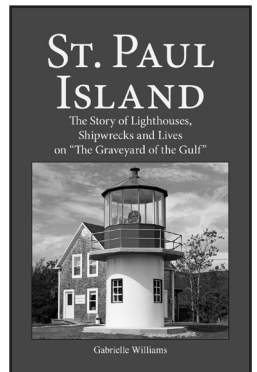
St. Paul Island
